Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals

- 100% Graduation Rate and 70% demonstrating post-secondary readiness
- Move third grade students 30 points closer to proficiency in Language Arts/Literacy as measured by SBA
- Move students 40 points closer to proficiency on SBA Mathematics
- Show growth of 8 % in Social-Emotional Learning competencies as measured by SES
- English Language Program attain 25% English Learner Reclassification
- 96% Overall Attendance

Farmdale School Goals:

- In order to build a strong foundation for literacy, third grade students will achieve -17.2 Distance from Standard or higher on the Smarter Balanced Assessment English Language Arts in 2024-2025 as measured by the LAUSD School Targets Dashboard.
- By June 2025, parents who state "This school offers extra activities for my child's personal growth." will increase from 84% to 87% as measured by the School Experience Survey.
- In order to improve foundational reading skills and Reclassification rates for English Language Learners, by June of 2025, the percentage of students in Benchmark and Above will be increased by 15% as measured by DIBELS Composite Score from BOY 2024-2025 to EOY 2024-2025.
- In order to address our low status for English language Learner and Students with Disabilities, by June 2025 we will reduce the percentage of chronic absenteeism by 5% from 34.4% to 29.4% as measured by the Focus Dashboard Attendance Data.
